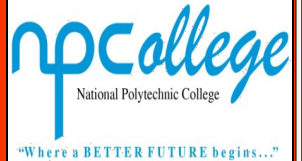

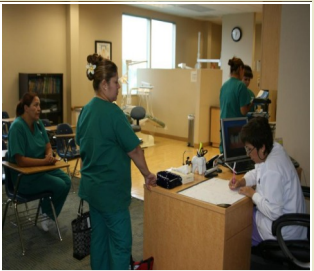

HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH



September was a month full of festivities as well as recognition because we celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month. National Hispanic Heritage week started under the presidency of Lyndon Johnson and it was extended by president Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a 30 day period starting September 15th and ending October 15th. September 15th is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries such as; Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala Honduras and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence days on September 16th and September 18th. Dia De La Raza which is October 12th, falls within this 30

day period. Eva Romero Jacues was recognized this year for Hispanic Heritage Month. At only 4'11, one inch short of the minimum height, Eva did not qualify for the Army Air Corps during WW11. However, she had two advantages; three years of college and she spoke English and Spanish.



Though she was far away from the action, she escaped a major disaster when a plane on which she was to take on a tour of New Guinea crashed in the jungle. Another inspirational figure to the Hispanic community is Frank-

lin R. Chang-Diaz. Raised in a poor family in Costa Rica, Franklin studied hard to become a scientist and was the first Hispanic person to enter the space program. Franklin became an astronaut in 1981, he is also a veteran of six space missions and has spent nearly 1,300 hours in space.



Although Eva and Romero have a few differences, one thing they both have in common is that they accomplished an education and they broke barriers. They truly are an inspiration to all Latinos in the United States.
